Debbie welcomed all to the meeting. The previous meeting's minutes were reviewed. Chip made a motion to approve the minutes. Margaret seconded the motion. The minutes were accepted. The midyear SRI and SMI data was not available to review.

The December Math Progress Monitoring Data was reviewed. It is a one minute snapshot of each student's progress taken on December 6th. The data shows significant improvements. Some grades were up more than others.

Steve asked how this new information affects the school's standing with the state. Chip indicated that under turnaround status, the school could close like a recent school in Granite District, be turned over to a charter agency, change administration and staff or take another route. With the targeted support of the district and school board we should know their recommendation soon.

Haydee asked how this information will be alerted to the parents. When discussing it with other parents, they were shocked and dismayed and wanted to help this great school. Heidi said it has been in the newsletter but a skylert could go out also.

Chip reported that many changes were instituted last year and we are seeing the results of the hard work put in. This year has been exciting and rewarding. Teachers still have great energy. They are focusing on results.

Nanette asked what the test results look like for the median student. Chip said their disaggregation on the last data had been on the bottom quartile and English Language Learner. For the DIBELS report he will try to have it disaggregated for all.

The LandTrust was discussed. It will be finalized in March. Most of it will stay the same. We will look at the disaggregated testing info and see if we can increase our goal to more than 60%.

The Child Access Routing Plan and Space Available Bussing was discussed. Debbie noted that with construction slated to start on I-15, it will affect Oak street and the Wasatch (8000s) entrance. There is currently no sidewalk there for students crossing to the middle and elementary schools. Construction vehicles in and out can prove dangerous. Chip had a look at a currently unapproved plan that widens the road and adds sidewalk. That entrance may need to be closed during construction.

The Dress Code Policy Revision was reported on. Debbie directed the board to review the policy and report back with any problems or questions. She said most of the changes made the dress code more gender neutral and didn't unfairly target young women.
